

## Hook Size Charts

The chart below may help you determine the size of the hook you're holding. Sizes are approximate, especially the larger sizes, as they vary from manufacturer to manufacturer. They also change over time. Lengths vary depending on what type of hook it is. This is one reason to check gauge on projects where size matters as an older hook might be a different size in millimeters than a newer one.
